SHORT BIONOTE

Sofia Koukouli is Assistant Professor in Social Policy at the Social Work Department of the Hellenic Mediterranean University. She earned a BA in Sociology and a second one in Political Science both from the University of Paris X-Nanterre. She received a MA in Political Science from New York University and holds a Ph.D. in Social Medicine from the Medical School, University of Crete. During the last years she coordinated: a) a Leonardo-Transfer of Innovation research project on the needs of the abandoned children, adolescents and elderly people, a comparative study among seven European countries; and b) an Archimedes III project on the young adults of Crete and the factors influencing their transition from adolescence to adulthood. She has authored and co-authored publications in international and national peer-reviewed scientific journals and presented her work in numerous conferences. She is teaching health and social care policy, social policy for vulnerable groups, family policy and courses on social rights and discrimination issues. She is also participating since 2003 as invited professor in the Master's Program of "Public Health and Health Care Management" at the University of Crete. Her research interests include: the link between social factors and health, social policy issues for vulnerable groups with emphasis on needs assessment for health and social care services, quality of care, family policy, and comparative social policy. She is also a founding member of the "Quality of Life Laboratory" at the School of Health and Social Welfare (TEI of Crete). She served for approximately seven years as Head of the Department of Social Work and one year as Alternate Dean of the School of Health and Social Welfare.
