Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous) was established as a result of the indefatigable industry and foresight of the CMI Congregation. Rajagiri College of Social Sciences has been placed 31st, 28th, 35th, 43rd in the country in the 'Colleges' category by the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) of the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India, for the year 2021, 2020, 2019, 2018 respectively.

National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2017, MHRD, Govt of India, placed RCSS 25th in the country in the 'Colleges' category. The School of Management placed in the 51-75 rank band in the 'Management' category by the National Institutional Ranking Framework.

Rajagiri College of Social Sciences was selected and granted with "College with Potential for Excellence" (CPE) status by the University Grants Commission (UGC) of India in 2016.

The validity of the accreditation of A++ grade with CGPA 3.83 has been extended upto 2021 by NAAC. The college was re-accredited with A grade with CGPA of 3.7 on 4 point scale by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Govt. of India, in the third cycle of assessment in 2013, after being re-accredited with A+ status in 2007 in the second cycle of assessment and Five Star status in 2000.

The college was granted Autonomous Status by the University Grants Commission (UGC) in 2014.Rajagiri School of Social Work, started in the year 1955 was one of the pioneering institutions in south India, establishing programmes and setting standards in the field of social work education.

Background

There are certain prerequisites for health which include peace, adequate economic resources (and their distribution), food and shelter, clean water, a stable ecosystem, sustainable resource use, and access to basic human rights. The recognition of these prerequisites highlights the links between social and economic conditions, structural changes, the physical environment, individual lifestyles and health.

This Health Promotion Conference would provide a platform to discuss the current developments and models in the field of Health Promotion. Health promotion is a comprehensive process directed towards enabling people to take action and it is done by, with and for people either as individuals or as groups. The conference would explore the avenues to strengthen the skills and capabilities of individuals to take action and the capacity of groups or communities to act collectively to exert control over the determinants of health and achieve positive change. This will aim at developing personal skills, strengthening community action, and creating supportive environments for health, backed by healthy public policy. Thus, this health promotion conference focus on actions directed at determinants of health such as, peace, adequate economic resources, food and shelter, clean water, a stable ecosystem, sustainable resource use, and access to basic human rights, which is summarized in terms of social and economic conditions. structural changes, the physical environment, individual lifestyles and health.

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
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Guidelines for Abstract
